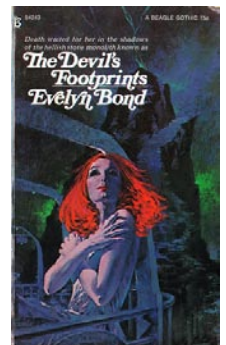
Original. Amity Powell hires Vedder to expose a charlatan named Sekhar.

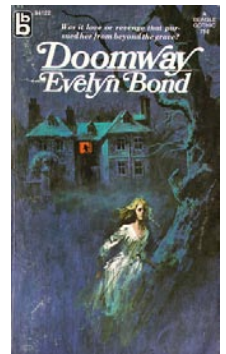
Original. Sharon Crosby takes a cruise in spite of spooky predictions.

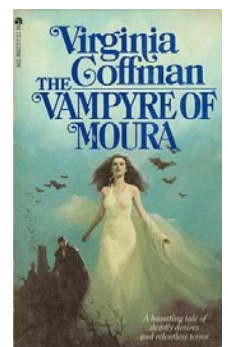
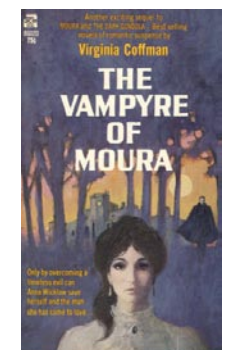
The Vampyre of Moura.

It is now run by the Stavko family, one or more of whom may be vampires, but the novel dances around the suggestion without being overt.

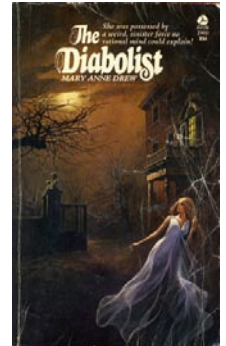
A Satanic Gothic, original. Riva Landau fights a corrupt government and voodoo when she travels to Haiti.

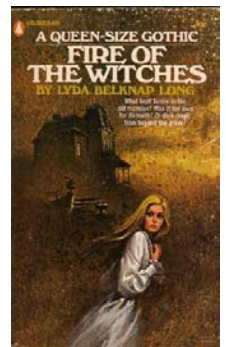

A Queen-Size Gothic, original. Janice rescues her sister Marna from a witch cult. Contains suggestions of clairvoyance.

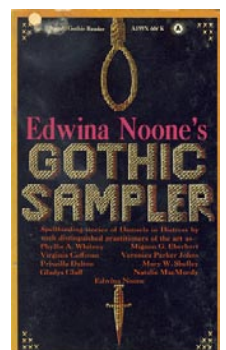

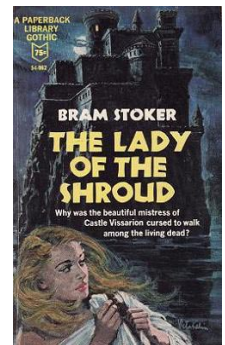

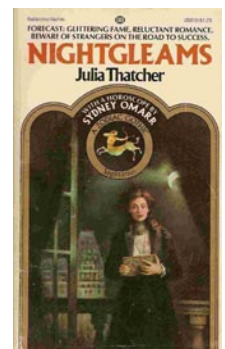


Thatcher, Julia pseudonym of Don[ald] R[oynold] Bensen (1927-) US

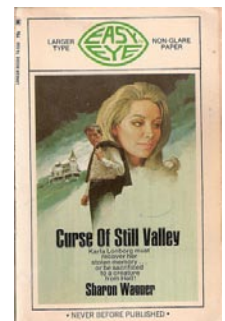


Wagner, Sharon [Blythe] [G] (1936-) US

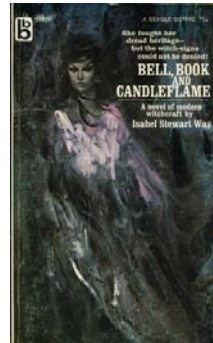


Way, Isabel Stewart (1904-1978) US
